The University of Louisville Schools of Medicine and Dentistry are one of 12 sites selected for a new summer academic program for undergraduates called the Summer Medical and Dental Education Program, funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. Administered by AAMC and ADEA, this six-week summer residential program offers participants three hours of academic credit along with free housing, meals, stipend, and travel reimbursement. Eighty rural, minority and disadvantaged undergraduates (approximately 60 pre-medical and 20 pre-dental) are eligible to apply for this program.



The Kentucky AHEC program provided key support as Rebecca Stutsman, AHEC/HETC Program Coordinator at University of Louisville School of Medicine, created the proposal this past summer. This UofL program will run from June 4 to July 14 and will provide a great link between UofL's pre-college and MCAT/DAT summer programs.
