



MEDICAL READING

Purpose: To encourage Health Science students to improve their reading comprehension, oral communication, and teamwork skills.

Description: This event is for teams of three (3) competitors per team. Round One will be a multiple choice test. The questions will require the competitors to apply, analyze, synthesize or evaluate information from the assigned books for the year. A selected number of teams will qualify for Round Two. Round Two teams will report to the site of the event where they will be presented questions by a panel of judges. Questions will be of the same caliber as Round One questions but in short answer format. Each team member will answer five (5) questions, and five (5) additional questions will be answered as a team.

Dress Code: Competitors must be in official HOSA uniform or in proper business attire. Bonus points will be awarded for proper dress. All team members must be properly dressed to receive bonus points.

SPECIAL RULES FOR 2011-12

At the time the book list was announced, all 5 recommended books were in print. Since then, Diagnoses from the Dead has gone out of print. It is available as an eBook at BarnesandNoble.com for \$5.99. Out of respect to those schools who already purchased this book, it will remain on the list as an alternate book, and Body of Work has been added as a second alternate. Body of Work was a Medical Reading book in 2008-09. Teams have a choice of reading either Diagnoses from the Dead OR Body of Work, and will tell the judges which book they wish to be questioned from at the start of Round Two.

- Rules and Procedures**
1. Competitors in this event must be active members of HOSA in good standing in the category in which they are registered to compete (Secondary or Postsecondary/Collegiate).
 2. The books for the year will be selected by the National Competitive Events program staff and will relate to Health Science Education curriculum competencies.
 3. **For 2011-12**, Round One is a 40-question, multiple-choice test (10 questions per book) from the four primary books, that is administered during the event orientation. There will be a one-hour time limit. No study lists will be provided. The individual scores will be added to determine a team score. A selected number of teams will advance to Round Two. If needed, a tie-breaker will be the scoring of ten (10) pre-selected questions from the written exam.
 4. Team numbers and order of competition will be pre-assigned on a random selection basis.
 5. Teams who qualify for Round Two will report to the site of the event at the appropriate time. Competitors will be seated at a table in the front of a room, in clear view of the judges.
 6. Teams will be introduced to the judges by their team number and/or school name, and further identified as competitor A, B and C.

8. Teams will read all four primary books. The **primary books** for 2011-12 include:
- ***Breakthrough!: How the 10 Greatest Discoveries in Medicine Saved Millions and Changed Our View of the World*** by Jon Queijo
 - ***The Blue Death: The Intriguing Past and Present Danger of the Water You Drink*** by Robert D. Morris
 - ***The Checklist Manifesto: How to Get Things Right*** by Atul Gawande
 - ***Every Patient Tells a Story: Medical Mysteries and the Art of Diagnosis*** by Lisa Sanders

Teams will choose ONE alternate book. The two **alternate** book choices are:

- ***Diagnoses from the Dead: The Book of Autopsy*** by Richard Prayson
- ***Body of Work: Meditations on Mortality from the Human Anatomy Lab*** by Christine Montross

9. **For 2011-12 only** - The judges will have a list of four (4) questions from each assigned book with suggested answers/information. All teams will be asked four questions from each of the four primary books. For the final four questions, the team will tell the judges if they want the questions from EITHER *Diagnoses from the Dead* OR *Body of Work*.
10. All questions from the first book will be given to the team before proceeding to the next book. The Moderator will ask Team member A, question 1, Team member B, question 2. etc. The team will be given the team question. Each judge will rate the response to each question independently. The Moderator will continue with the next book, until all books have been covered.
11. The questions asked during the event are considered to be a secret topic. Professional ethics demand that competitors DO NOT discuss or reveal the secret topic for ANY event until after the event has concluded. Competitors who violate this ethical standard will be disqualified.
12. When questions are being asked of individual team members, no help will be allowed from teammates. When the five (5) "team" questions are offered, team members may discuss and one member of the team must respond within the 30-second time limit.
13. Competitors are not allowed to bring books or any materials into the room.
14. Each competitor (team) will have a **maximum of 30 seconds to complete the answer to a question**. The timekeeper will begin timing the 30 seconds when the moderator finishes asking the question the first time. Competitors may ask for the question to be repeated, but the timing will continue. At the conclusion of 30 seconds, the timekeeper will say "time", and the competitor must stop.
15. All judge scores will be added together to determine a total team score. Should a tie occur, the highest team average from the written test will be used to break the tie.
16. Competitors must be familiar with and adhere to the "**General Rules and Regulations of the National HOSA Competitive Events Program**".

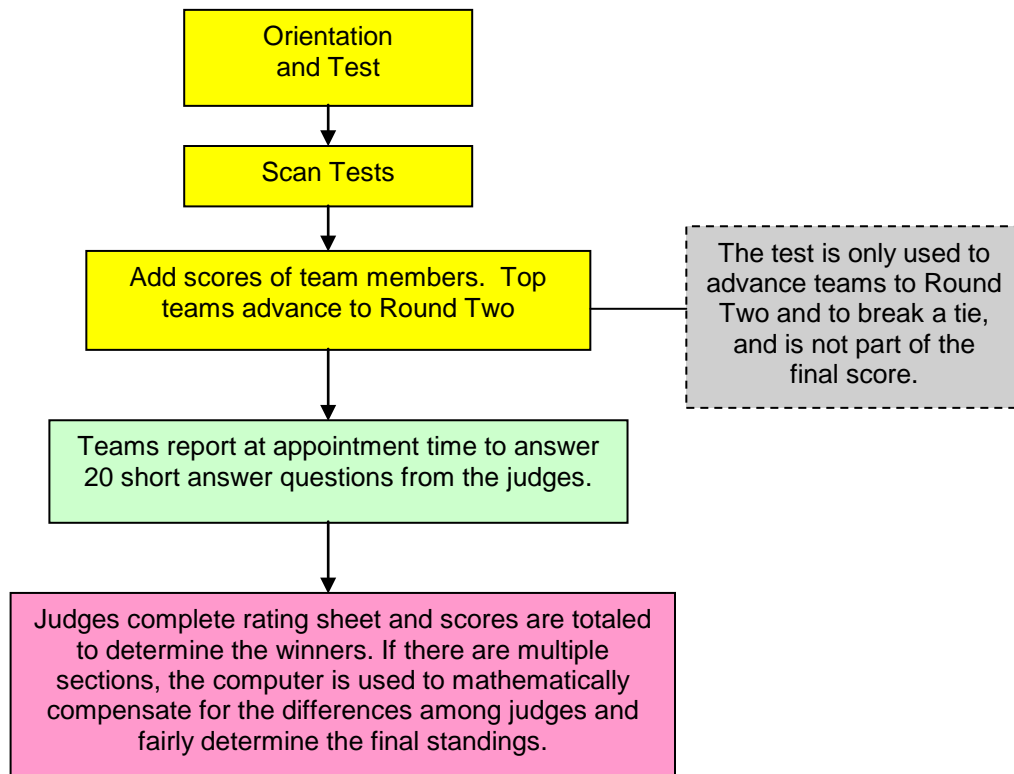
Required Personnel (Per Section):

1. Room with a table for 3 in the front of the room for competitors, another table for 3-5 judges and one large table for the chairman and supplies
2. One (1) stopwatch

4. Pens for judges
5. One (1) copy of the questions/answers for each judge
6. One set of assigned books per section
7. Large letters (A, B, and C) to identify each individual team member
