New for 2016 - 2017

Editorial updates and clarifications have been made to guidelines.

The rating sheet has been updated.

Purpose:

To encourage HOSA members to improve their skills in speaking and their ability to organize and present facts (or information) about a topic which is related to a specific theme.

Description:

Competitors shall develop a speech related to a selected national topic. The topic for the year will be announced at the conclusion of the previous International Leadership Conference (ILC) in June.

2016 - 2017 Topic: Leadership - Service - Engagement

Dress Code:

Competitors must be in official HOSA uniform or in proper business attire. Bonus points will be awarded for proper dress.

Eligibility:

In order to participate in this event, the competitor must meet all of the following requirements:

- ✓ MUST be classified under the provision of the 2004 reauthorized Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA).
- ✓ Submit a completed form from the appropriate school official stating that the competitor is classified under the provisions of IDEA 2004 following the submission directions on page 4 of these guidelines. Five (5) bonus points will be awarded to the competitor for submitting the eligibility form correctly.

Rules and Procedures

- 1. Competitors in this event must be active members of HOSA in good standing in the Middle School or Secondary division.
- 2. Competitors must be familiar with and adhere to the <u>"General Rules and Regulations of the National HOSA Competitive Events Program (GRR)."</u>
- 3. Competitors shall report at the appropriate time and place designated. The competitor shall be introduced to the judges by the competitor number.
- 4. Use of notes during the speech is permitted. Electronic notecards (on a tablet, smart phone, laptop, etc.) are permitted, but may not be shown to judges. The speech shall be up to five (5) minutes in length. **Props may NOT be used.**
- 5. The timekeeper shall present a flash card advising the competitor when there is one (1) minute remaining. The competitor will be stopped when the five minutes are up.
- 6. All competitors shall speak on the same announced topic.
- 7. In the event of a tie, a tie breaker will be determined by the areas on the rating sheet section(s) with the highest point value in descending order.

8. There will be no microphones used for this event.
